01 Table Decorating

THEME: "Farmhouse Chic"

RULES

- Exhibitor to create a tablescape that best depicts the theme. Table arrangement must use the following as a minimum:
 - one (1) card table,
 - · one (1) chair,
 - one (1) plate,
 - one (1) piece of glassware,
 - one (1) knife, one (1) spoon, one (1) fork,
 - one (1) napkin,
 - a tablecloth and/or placemat,
 - one (1) centerpiece, and
 - a menu indicating the meal choices appropriate for the theme
- All items used must appropriately relate to the theme
- The exhibitor must have included the minimum items required to qualify for judging.
- Other accessories may be added, but the table's design balance should not be compromised.

- 5. All decorations must be on the table and fit within the perimeters of the table.
- 6. **DO NOT USE** liquids, real food items, or items that will spoil.
- 7. Use a standard size card table.
- 8. While the Fair takes reasonable care to protect all items from injury or damage, the Fair nor are its staff in any way to be held responsible for accidents, loss, or damage by water, fire, theft or otherwise.
- 9. All items to be supplied by the exhibitor.
- 10. Table must be able to be easily moved after judging.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Overall creativity; Functionality; Overall Appearance; Appropriate tableware and decorations; Conveys the theme; Balance and Design.

LIMIT: Fair reserves the right to limit to 8 exhibitors.

NOTE: If more than **8 exhibitors register by the June 30 deadline**, a random drawing will be held. Exhibitor will only be notified only if they are not chosen.

DEPT. 019 - SECTION 04 PHOTOGRAPHY

RULES

- 1. The exhibitor must have taken the photo.
- 2. Entry Limit: One (1) entry per exhibitor per class.
- 3. All entries must be color prints. Print size: $8" \times 10"$ only!
- All entries must be clearly marked on the back of the photo with a) Photo Title, b) Entrant's Name, c) Direction of Top Edge of the photo, d) the Category (see below), and e) Date Taken.
- Enter the PHOTO ONLY. No mountings, mattes or frames. Fair will provide the plastic page protectors.
- 6. Digital photos Post-processing may be performed as long as it is applied to the entire image as a whole. Examples of acceptable post-processing techniques include (but are not limited to) cropping, sizing, color mode, color casting, color balance, sharpen, unsharp mask, blur, and any other similar or equivalent

- effects. Remember, these must be applied to the entire image as a whole.
- However, digital photo content can not have any post-processing to add, remove, or move any elements from the photograph. This includes (but is not limited to) the subject, background, distractions, and shadows.
- 8. No spot-editing or selective-editing is to be performed on the digital photograph. Spot-editing is defined as any type of editing that affects selective spots or portions of the image. This includes (but is not limited to) paintbrush, dodge, burn, sponge, clone stamp, airbrush, smudge, shapes, pencil, pen, red-eye removal, and any other filters/tools that use selections or do not edit the image as a whole.
- 9. The exhibitor must have taken the photographs and the photo may not have been entered before in the Kimberton Community Fair.
- 10. Classes 04 and 05 are restricted to photos taken of subjects or events from the 2022 Kimberton Community Fair. All entries become the property of the Fair and the Fair reserves the right to the onetime/no-charge printing right for photographs entered in this class. Winning photos may be used in the 2024 Catalog or Website.
