RULES

1. Refer to General Rules, Livestock Health Rules & Regulations, Care Guidelines, and Code of Show Ring Ethics.
2. This show is not a sanctioned show.
3. Breeds may not be combined for Group Classes. Only Does entered in Age Classes may be shown in Group Classes.
4. Base date for computing age is Show Day.
5. The Fair Committee reserves the right to change unofficial breeds to "All Other Purebreds".
6. Exhibitors are responsible for setting up/ tearing down own pens
7. Exhibitors must clean out bedding from pen(s) before leaving grounds.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. A Veterinary-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) must exist for all animals to be exhibited. This requirement can be fulfilled in any of the following means:
 - a. A VCPR Form with veterinarian's signature.
 - b. A signed statement on the Fair's Entry Form for the animal(s) being exhibited. "I attest and affirm that a "veterinary consultation relationship" - as that phrase is defined in the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Law found at 3 Pa. C.S.A. 2501 et seq. and any amendments thereto - exists with regard to any animals I will be exhibiting."
 - c. A valid Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (VCVI) - valid for thirty (30) days after the date of issuance and for only one destination.
 - d. The Fair will retain copies of the Entry Forms for a period of one (1) year. If the Owner/Caretaker is under 18 years of age, the signature of a parent/guardian is required.
2. Goats appearing to be unhealthy upon arrival, including caseous lymphadenitis, sore mouth, active ringworm, foot rot, warts, lice, mange and abscesses, will **NOT** be allowed to enter the grounds.

3. Individual animal identification is required for all sheep.

Official ID includes:

- a. A USDA ear tag with a US shield; or
- b. A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database aka scrapie tattoo (flock ID in the right ear—state postal code and letters/numbers—and individual animal ID in the left ear); or
- c. A breed registration tattoo if animals are accompanied by a registration certificate (copy acceptable) and the tattoo is legible.

4. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.

5. Current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.

- 06 Doe in Milk, under 2 years
- 07 Doe in Milk, 2 years and under 3 years
- 08 Doe in Milk, 3 years and under 5 years
